What's LACNIC?

LACNIC is an organization:

- **Who manage the Numbering Internet Resources for the Latinamerican and part of the Caribbean region assuring that all the interested parties have an equitable access to those resources and working based in spirit of stewardship and services to the community.**
- **Not for profit, incorporated in Uruguay and recognized as an International Organization by the Uruguayan Government.**
- **Membership based.**
- **That works under policies that are developed in open, transparent and participative bottom up processes.**
- **Who represents the effort of the regional industry to manage the above mentioned resources in a self-regulation manner.**

LACNIC became the forth RIR in the world in 31/10/2002 through the ICANN Board resolution in Shanghai meeting

VISION –

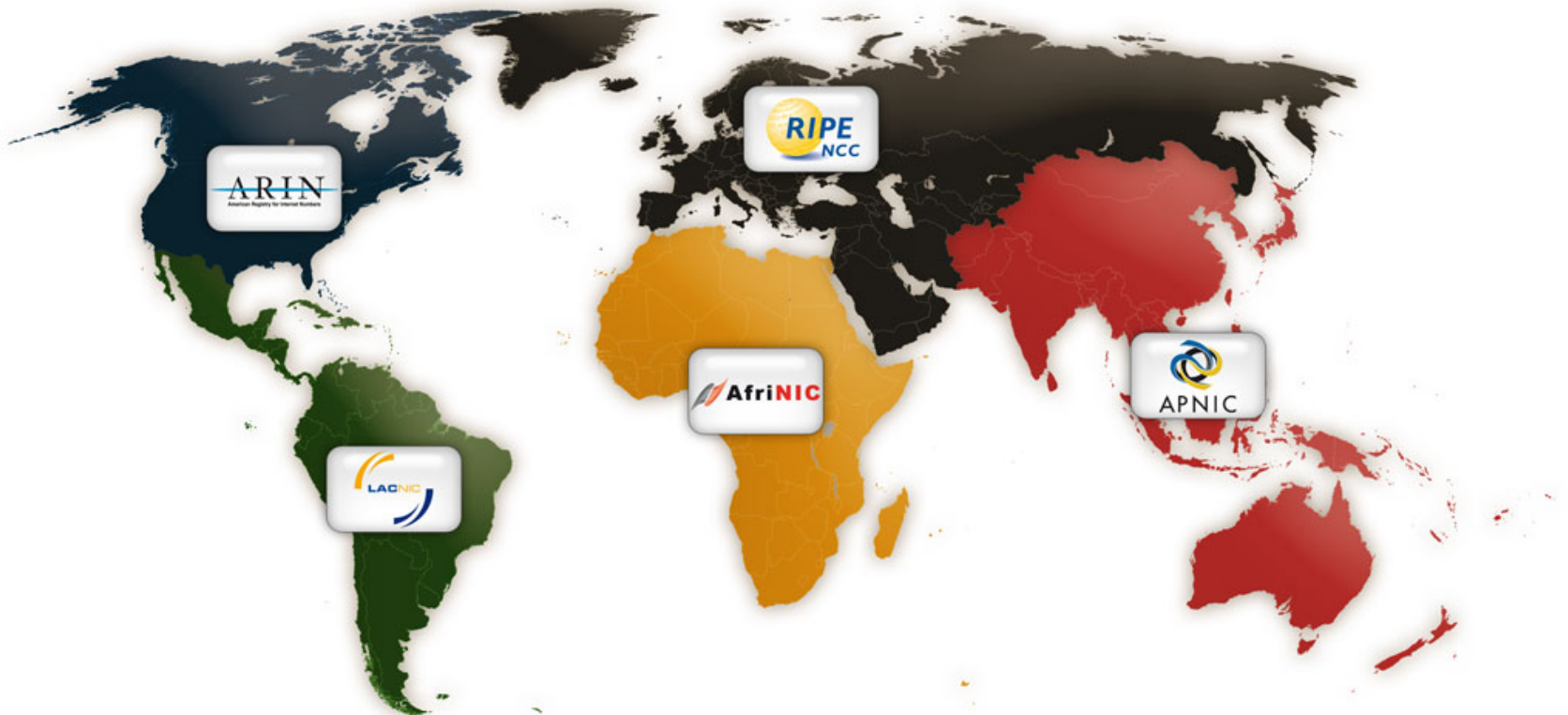
To be a leader in the construction and articulation of collaborative efforts for Internet development and stability in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Regional Internet Registries System





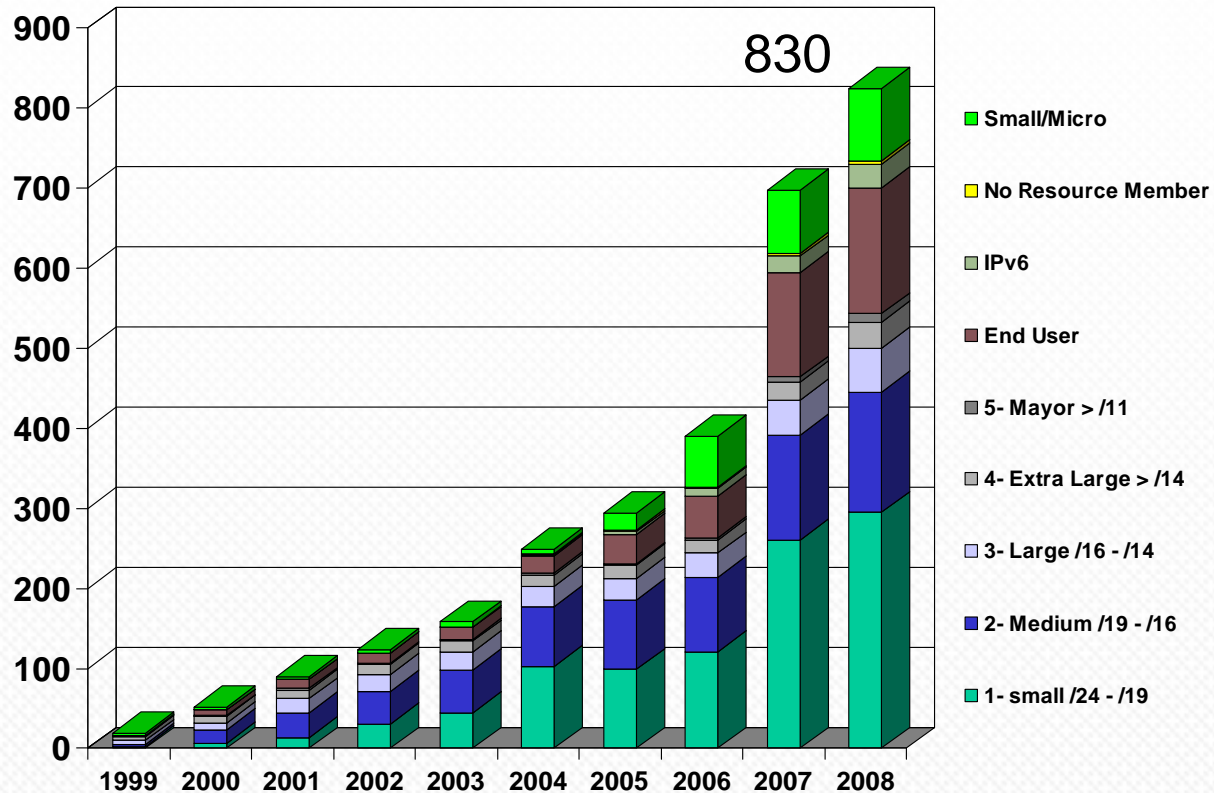

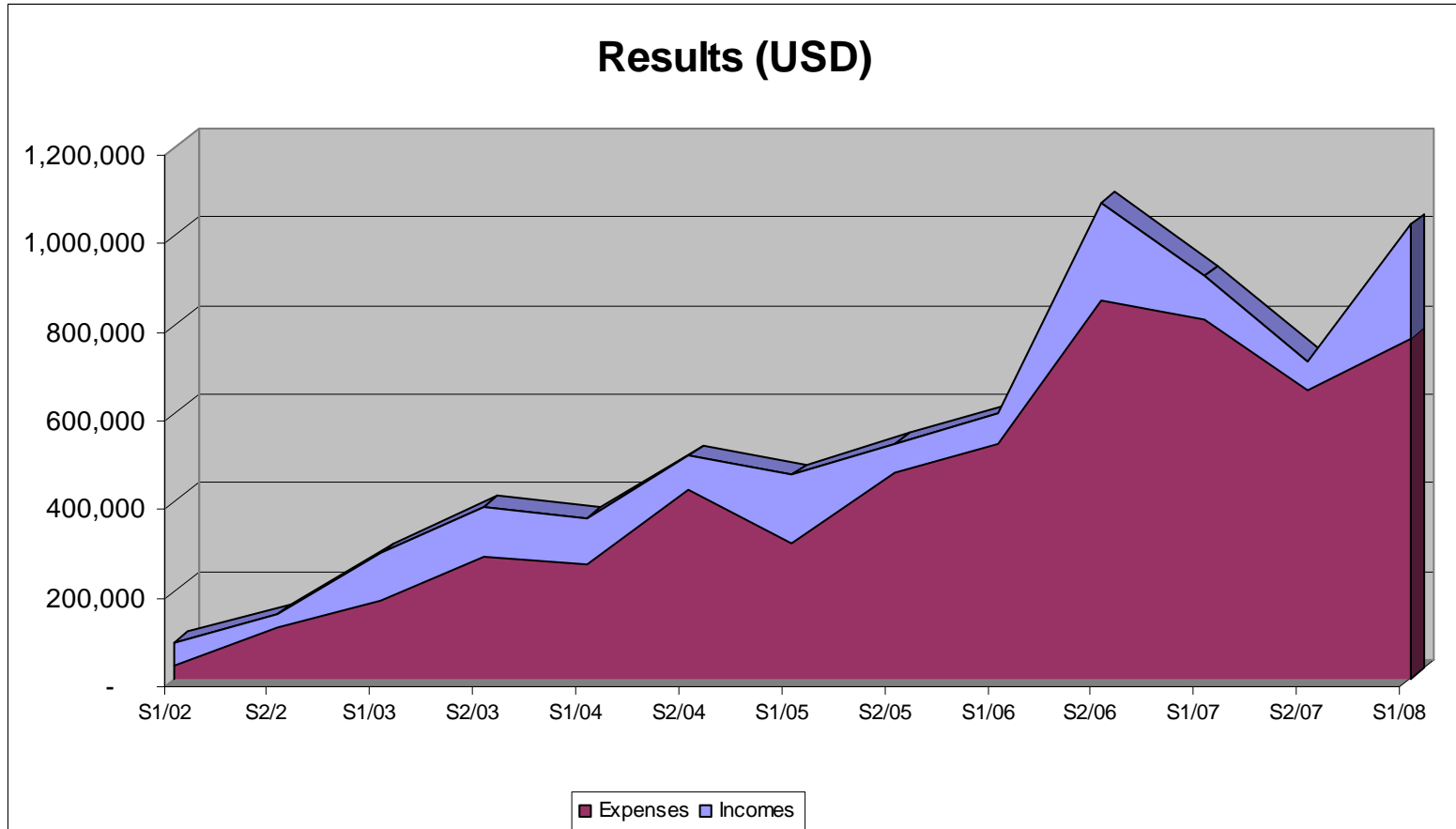

LACNIC and the ENHANCED COOPERATION

WSIS – Tunisia 2005

Antecedents.

- Long discussion through WSIS (2003), WGIG and Prepcom meetings.

At least two visions.

- To improve the Governance of the Internet from the existing organizations.
(EVOLUTION)
- To improve the Governance of the Internet creating new Governance structures.
(CREATION)

There was agreement on the fact that the current governance could be improved but there was not agreement on the ways to do that.

Agreement about a set of principles and the value of the Multistakeholder Model.

WSIS – Final resolution

71. The process towards enhanced cooperation, to be started by the UN Secretary-General, involving all relevant organizations by the end of the first quarter of 2006, will involve all stakeholders in their respective roles, will proceed as quickly as possible consistent with legal process, and will be responsive to innovation. **Relevant organizations should commence a process towards enhanced cooperation involving all stakeholders**, proceeding as quickly as possible and responsive to innovation. The same relevant organizations shall be requested to provide annual performance reports.

The introduction of the term : Enhanced Cooperation

Neither Create nor Evolve got enough support. There was the need for innovating in the pursuit of final agreements.

Conclusion

Disagreement in creating something new, except the IGF.

No support to the status quo.

BIG CHALLENGE: to develop new collaboration/cooperation models for increasing the participation of all the stakeholders in their respective roles without creating new mechanisms/structures.

LACNIC - 2003

Very low interaction with governments

No participation in any governmental forum

No cooperation agreements with governmental agencies.

LACNIC 2008

Great involvement in WSIS process

High participation in IGF. (Advisory Group, workshops, main session panels)

Active participation in eLAC2007/eLAC2010

- **Proposals that have been adopted.**
- **Support to the Infrastructure group.**

Permanent communication with governments.

Members of CITELE, cooperation agreement with CTU

Cooperation activities in partnership with governments of Venezuela, Argentina, Ecuador, Uruguay, Curaçao, Cuba, El Salvador among others.

New ways of participation

Participation of governmental representatives in LACNIC meetings.

Open meetings:

- **Curaçao – May 2008**
 - **Together with the Caribbean IGF (CTU)**
- **Montevideo – August 19th, 20th.**
 - **Open meeting for facilitating the participation of governments and civil society.**
 - **Reports, discussion and feedback.**
 - **Regional preparatory meeting. Multistakeholder debate on the main 4 IGF tracks.**

What is the status today?

Very good relation with regional governments, civil society organizations and private sector.

Very active in the articulation of collaborative efforts.

Open to dialogue with any stakeholder

The **Enhanced Cooperation** is in place. The international debate has been useful and productive to make all of us to increase the level of interaction and communication with other stakeholders.
